

KILDARE FULLY AWARE OF CLARE THREAT THIS TIME AROUND

Clare are the visitors to St Conleth's Park on Sunday, for Round 2 of the Allianz FL Division 2 South and following last season's set-back in Ennis when The Banner came out on top by a single point, The Lilies will certainly be all out to turn the tables on this occasion.

That game, back in February 2020, ultimately cost Kildare promotion and this weekend's clash is once again a vital game in the revamped division now in groups, Cork and Laois making up the four in this Division 2 South section.

Both Kildare and have opened with impressive victories last weekend, Kildare over Cork while Clare had a comfortable win in Ennis over a disappointing Laois side.

From the Kildare side that lined out last February against Clare, a mere six players started last Sunday, a firm indication that Jack O'Connor is now firmly putting his, and his management team's stamp on proceedings.

Some of the most experienced players have left the Kildare camp from back then including Peter Kelly, Keith Cribbin, Ben McCormack, Mattie Byrne and Johnny Byrne, while also missing from last weekend through injury and suspension were Shea Ryan, Niall Kelly and Paddy Brophy while the experienced Fergal Conway came on a second half substitute as did Neil Flynn.

Clare also look to be a much changed side, something similar to Kildare, just six played against Laois last week that played in that win over Kildare in 2020.

So it's all to play for on Sunday.

Last week The Lilies opened slowly but gradually got themselves into the game, led by a point (somewhat fortuitously it has to be said) but really upped their game in the second half.

Two second goals from Kevin Flynn and Jimmy Hyland sealed victory.

Clare, on the other hand seemed to be in control throughout their clash with Laois and will come to Newbridge with no shortage of confidence.

These teams met the previous season (2019) in the League in Newbridge, Kildare coming out on top 1-16 to 1-10, the goal

coming from Kevin Feely with Neil Flynn in sparkling form hitting five points while Jimmy Hyland knocked over three from play.

Eoin Clear, at no 11 was the Clare top scorer last Sunday, hitting over no less than ten points, including four frees, one 45 and a sideline while Daniel Walsh made a big impression on his debut at this level, finding the Laois net in the opening half as The Banner led by six at half time and were never really under any real pressure after that. A strong midfield pairing of Cathal O'Connor and Darren O'Neill saw the Clare front men get plenty of supply as Clare went on to win 1-16 to 0-12.

All to play for in a vital game for both counties and with just three games in the group, there is little room for manoeuvre.

One thing for sure though is that following last season's set-back in Ennis, Kildare will line out on their home patch on Sunday fully aware of the task ahead and fully aware a win could set them up for a semi final spot.

Ag Féachaint Siar – Cill Dara Hurling in the 1960s – "Hurling Champions of All Ireland Again"

After a long famine and a series of droughts, Kildare hurling reached new heights in the 1960s - a decade which brought three All-Ireland titles to the county. Junior successes in 1962 and 1966 prefaced an Intermediate title in 1969.

During the previous three decades, players from army club teams often outnumbered native club players on county teams but by the '60s the balance was changing rapidly. The 1962 team included five Army personnel, and they were vital to that success. The '66 team lined out in the All-Ireland final in Glebe Farm, Warwickshire, with only one man from a military club. And in 1969, there was no representative of an Army team.

Apart from having only one Army representative, there was a huge change in the composition of the '66 team compared to the '62 lineout: only four players remained to savour a second All-Ireland success. They were Pat Dunney (captain), and Peter Sharpe from Eire Óg, and Frank Fogarty and Billy Quinn, both from Moorefield. Dunney made his senior inter-county debut as a sixteen-year-old wearing the No. 1 shirt in 1962, and in a glittering career captained Kildare to the '66 and '69 titles.

Eoghan Corry writes in his *Kildare GAA Centenary* history that apart from Billy Quinn, the 'Veteran' of the 1962 team, the

average age of the '66 team was twentyone and a half. With several new players lining out, Tommy Carew top scored with four goals against Meath in the first round of the Leinster championship. Quinn, at 35, netted two goals in the Leinster final against 1965 winners, Wicklow, at Croke Park. And he produced a goal in the Home final against Kerry and another in the All-Ireland final.

Nine of the 1966 starting team lined out in the 1969 Intermediate final, continuity being a key factor in the development of a winning mentality. Ardclough, now becoming force in the county pecking order, had Colm O'Malley, Bobby Burke, Tommy Christian and Mick Dwane aboard while Eire Óg, five-time county champions from 1964 to '69, supplied Pat Dunney.



Mick O'Brien (Kilcock), Tommy Carew (Coill Dubh), Jack Wall (St Dermot's) and Nick Behan (Aer Lingus, formerly Éire Óg) were the other survivors. They were joined by goalkeeper Peter Connolly and Mick Mullins (both Eire Óg), Noel Burke (Ardclough), Jack O'Connell (St Brigid's), Seamus Malone (Coill Dubh) and his clubmate Tony Carew - brother of Tommy in whose honour the county senior trophy is named.

Those three All-Ireland titles set Kildare hurling on a rising curve, entry into the Leinster SHC and some very significant National League wins against Waterford, Laois, Kerry, Antrim and Dublin in the early '70s leading to a NHL quarter-final loss to Tipperary in 1974, and an All-Ireland 'B' win in the same year.


Not an Army man involved since the '66 All-Ireland final and Pat Dunney the only link in the '62, '66 and '69 teams! Yes, Kildare hurling had come a long way. Great credit was due to the county officers, to the people who developed the game in local areas and to the dedication of coaches and players who brought the game to a new level in the county and significantly enhanced the profile of Cill Dara in the hurling world.

NO EASY PICKINGS FOR KILDARE AS DERRY ARE THE VISITORS

While winning last season's Christy Ring Cup was the highlight of Kildare's hurling season, and with that came promotion to the Joe McDonagh Cup for this season, nevertheless the downside for David Herity's side was missing out on promotion from Division 2B.

That was a huge set-back and one feels if Kildare are to advance, playing at the highest possible league level is an absolute imperative to their cause.

Manager Herity made no bones of the fact that, at this stage, promotion is the number one item on his, and his team's agenda, especially when you consider that one of Kildare's Joe McDonagh Cup opponents, Westmeath, are operating in Division 1 (Group A) of the Allianz Hurling League and while they will, no doubt, find the going tough there, nevertheless the experience will stand to them not only for the Joe McDonagh but in the long term.

Kildare are in Division 2B of the Allianz Hurling League, along with Mayo, Donegal, Derry and Roscommon and while they had a bye on the first weekend hurling resumed, they opened their 2021 season with a comprehensive win over Donegal in St Conleth's Park on Sunday last.



Kildare certainly hit the ground running last weekend and the two points on offer were well and truely in the bag a long time before the long whistle arrived with The Lilies hitting an impressive 4-29 and conceding 14 points.

It really shows the difference between the hurling tiers when you see Donegal lost just one league game (Division 3) last season and that against fellow promoted side Armagh in their very first game back in January, before going on to capture the Nicky Rackard Cup, and then get no less than a 27 point hiding from Kildare in their opening game in Division 2B.

It was, nevertheless an impressive opener for David Herity's side and while they will, no doubt, come up against stronger opposition in the weeks to come, it was still the ideal start to begin this very important campaign.

On the face of it the Kildare panel look, if anything, a stronger one this time around from the team that won the Christy Ring. A few top players, experienced players, have returned and while they were not all available last weekend, nevertheless two of them, Johnny Byrne and Declan Flaherty, were very prominent against Donegal.

On Sunday The Lilies take on Derry, a side that has given them lots to think




about in previous seasons. When they met last term in the league the game ended in a high scoring draw, Derry 2-16 to 3-13, a game played in Owenbeg. The previous year (2019) Derry visited Newbridge in the league and went away victors, 0-21 to 1-16, so despite Derry opening this season's league with a defeat to Mayo, albeit by just two points, their recent league record against The Lilies has been fruitful to say the least.

There is little doubt though that the Kildare hurling star is on the rise. The enormous work being under taken in recent years at underage level is now paying dividends and on their day they will be a match for any team, at their level.

They will go into today's game with confidence high and while nothing can be taken for granted it would be a set-back if they were not to record back-to-back victories keeping their promotion hopes very much alive with two very tricky away games to come against Mayo and Roscommon.

Tar éis tús maith ag Cill Dara agust bhí siad chun tosaigh le deich bpointe ag an mbriseadh, agus chríochnaigh siad mar buaiteoirí le 27 bpointe.


